We focus mainly on the youth in disadvantaged areas, thus far we've reached out to over 10 000 pupils, we've visited disadvanged schools in North West where the seminar was officially lauched, Free State, Pretoria, Polokwane, Mpumalanga and Johannesburg.

We aim to change the mind-set of young people, to give them hope and advices on how to overcome any situation they come across in life.
